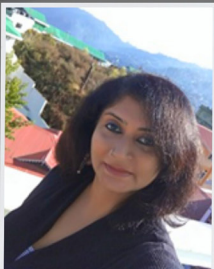
Foreword

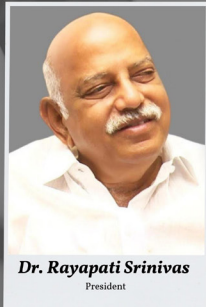

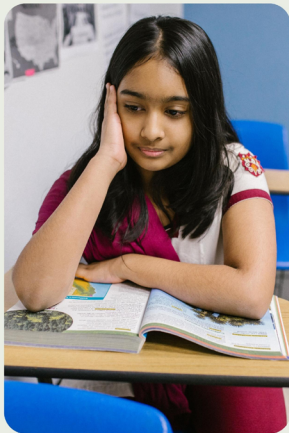


Life of Csbiars

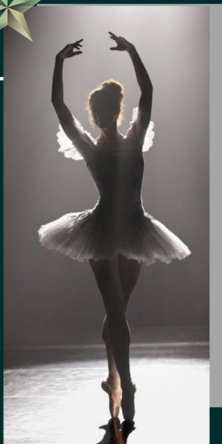


DANCING SOUL

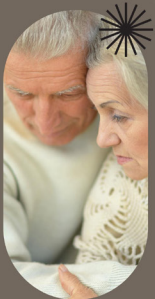

Journey to save water

AERATORS

Water is precious. It's a well-known fact that we all tend to ignore. But do you want your descendants to live in thirst? No, right. Let's think about it now.

The same ignorance pops up after some time. Well, it's not the same in the case of a 14-year-old school-going child in Bengaluru. Do you want to know about it? Ok, let's dive into this issue.

In 2019, Rishabh Prashobh from Bengaluru convinced two hotels, a school, and his apartment society to install aerators in water taps. Wait, wondering what these aerators are? Aerators are small mechanical devices that fit into water taps. It mixes air with water and ensures a consistent flow through the tap without any fluctuations caused by the change in pressure. A tap supplies 15 litres of water per minute. But by using aerators, we can cut the flow by more than half to six litres per minute.

We can save up to 1,200+ litres of water a month. His idea didn't stop there. He helped Mother Earth with his wings spread wide enough to reach me. How? The CSBS department of RVR & JC College of Engineering conducted an expert session on "Water Issues and Emerging Technologies" by Mr Satish Khade in association with The Art of Living. This session helped me a lot. I wish my friends and college is a part of this mission of saving water with his idea. This idea of fixing aerators in our college came into progress. We found 100 key places of water wastage on campus and in the hostel. Our management is impressed by this green initiative of saving water and is helping us financially. When a 14-year-old can do this much to save mother earth, why couldn't we? Let us also be a part of his initiative to promote sustainable solutions.



TINY TRIANGLE LEADS TO-- NO ANGLE OF SOLUTION

Every household consumes at least one milk packet every single day. What do we do after we get milk packets from the shop?

We tend to chop off a small triangle from the corner of the milk packet so that it might be easy for us to pour milk. We get milk packets from low-density polythene. The piece of chopped triangle causes a large scale of pollution. The tiny triangle becomes microplastic, and it would be impossible to recycle. Microplastic is hard to recycle, and they end up in landfills. What is the solution to this? If we replace milk packets with glass bottles, then prices will skyrocket. These tiny plastic pieces result in a rigorous effect on the environment. So we must come up with a solution to this. The easiest and simple way is "Do not snip off the tip of the milk packet. Just cutting a line halfway across the edge of the milk packet can avoid the separation of tiny triangles."

What are the ways to reduce pollution?

The thoughts that strike our mind are planting trees, reducing the usage of plastic, Automobiles, AIR conditioners, etc.

What is Pollution?

Pollution is nothing but resources that are not harvested by human beings. So why can't we utilize this pollution for creating something useful? One such thought led to the idea of AIR ink.

Anirudh Sharma, the co-founder of gravity labs, upcycled carbon from industries and exhausts and turned them into high-quality black ink. He told that his idea was born out of simple observation and people started using this ink for arts and the demand has rapidly grown up. If we consider an AIR ink marker, it is 40-50 minutes worth of car pollution which is now converted as a useful marker and the ink is also not so toxic. The carbon released into the atmosphere causes several diseases and is now useful to many people. It is rich and dark in color.

Such innovative ideas help us to create a completely different and safer world that will have lesser pollution. The polluters are receptive to giving wastes to gravity labs and then the lab restores them. The polluters get some economic advantage also for giving their waste. At present this kind of service is accessible in New York and future, these may start in India as well. So what are you waiting for?? Let us think of such ideas to reduce pollution which is causing several problems to our earth and make the earth a safer place to reside for us and our future generations also...

ROSELLE MUTTON



GONGURA Mutton curry



DO YOU KNOW THIS RECIPE?

It is one of the famous dishes in Andhra Pradesh and Telangana. Did you ever taste it? If not, have a try. You wouldn't regret your decision. It is known for its tangy and spicy flavours. It is the traditional recipe of Andhra Pradesh. You might have tried many dishes with mutton, but this is special because of the sourness of roselle leaves. Today, I would like to give some tips and health benefits of Gongura Mutton.

TIPS

1. For any food to be appealing, colour is necessary. So to have good colour, boil spinach for 20-30 seconds and grind with roselle leaves.
2. Ensure that the sizzling mutton pieces are tender.
3. Prefer the sourness to be less.
4. The taste of the dish would be even more succulent with onions.



BENEFITS OF HEALTHY FOOD

HEALTH BENEFITS

- Gongura mutton is rich in vitamins A, B1, B2, B9 and C.
- It is highly fibrous and contains fewer calories.
- Improves digestion and increases immunity.
- It protects our heart, liver and helps increase blood percentage.
- It is a proteinous dish.
- Today's generation doesn't care about the health but is very cautious about beauty. Roselle helps in smooth skin, prevents hair damage and reduce weight.



Method:

- Take mutton in a pressure cooker, add cumin powder, coriander powder, red chilli powder, 1/2 cup of water, and salt, and mix well and cook it with a closed lid till the mutton pieces are tender.
- Now in a pan, add oil, whole garam masala spices along with shahi jeera, chopped onions, and salt cook this till onions change colour to a golden brown.
- Now add ginger garlic paste and saute it till the raw flavour is gone.
- To it, even add turmeric powder, green chillies, and sorrel leaves, mix well and cook it on a very slow flame till oil oozes out.
- Then add cooked mutton along with the remaining water to the same pan and let it cook for 5 more minutes.
- At last, add some water (if required) then add garam masala powder, and coriander leaves and mix well.

When we have these many benefits, Why shouldn't we try them? Gongura mutton will be mouth watery and eye feast even with white rice. Enjoy the luscious Roselle Mutton curry this weekend. Try your hand not to swipe a food order on swiggy rather soil them to prepare a homemade healthy and savouring dish on your own.

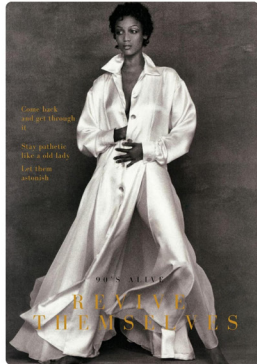

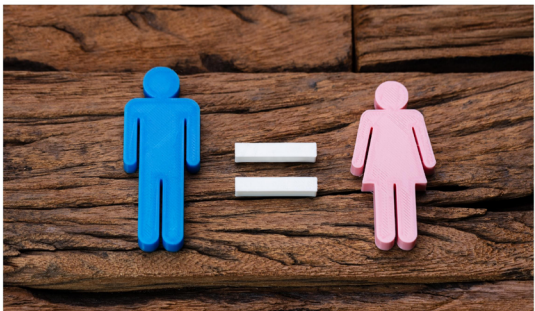

He is a plasma donor from Australia whose unusual blood plasma composition treated Rhesus disease. Christopher started donating blood when he was just 14. At the age of 14, Christopher had major chest surgery, and his doctors got to know there was something unusual in his blood plasma composition. Doctors didn't know where Christopher inherited this unique composition. They knew that by using this composition, they could develop anti-D injections. These injections help pregnant women suffering from Rhesus disease. In this kind of disease, the pregnant woman's blood starts attacking her unborn child. If the pregnant woman has a Rhesus negative blood type and the baby has a Rhesus positive blood type, then the condition leads to the death of the baby. To treat this type of condition, we require anti-D injections, and Christopher is known as a superhero of Australia. He brought happiness and joy into the lives of babies and their parents. Christopher retired from giving blood when he was 81 in the year 2019.

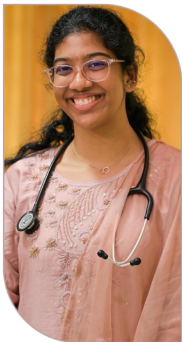
For example, girls should cook, and boys who aspire to become chefs or are seriously passionate about cooking can't face this society filled with such stereotypes.

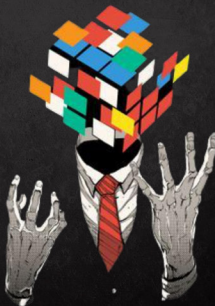

MAGIC CUBE

Let us know the history of an object which we are all quite familiar with, a Rubik's Cube. Do you know the reason behind its invention? If not, let's know its story.


Rubik's cube is also known as Magic Cube or Speed Cube. Hungarian sculptor and Professor of Architecture ERNO RUBIK in 1974 invented this cube. He introduced this to explain the concept of 3 Dimensional Geometry to his students. This speed Cube provides a great understanding of different complicated Mathematical Principles of Group Theory. Initially, the rotating cube was designed out of wood and its dimensions were 3 x 3 inches. Around 43 Quintillion configurations can be made out of this Magic Cube.



The first-ever competition on solving Rubik's cube was "The 1982 World Rubik's Cube Championship" which was held on 5th June 1982 in Budapest. Minh Thai, a Vietnamese student from Los Angeles, won the championship by solving this Puzzle Cube in 22.95 seconds.

Now you know the origin of the Rubik's cube, it started with a piece of wood, which costs around \$1.99, but now "The Masterpiece Rubik's Cube" is the most expensive in the world. Its price is around \$2.5 million. This cube contains 18 carats of Yellow Gold, 185 carats of Gem Stones, 34 carats of Rubies, 34 carats of Emerald, and 22.5 carats of Amethyst.
